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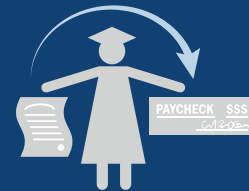

Youth Apprenticeship (YA)

Youth Apprenticeship (YA) is a rigorous one- or two-year elective statewide program for high school juniors and seniors. It combines academic and technical classroom instruction with mentored, paid, on-the-job learning that makes a real-world connection for students.

Alternative High School

ACTIVITY DATA

NTC's Alternative High School serves students at risk of not completing high school in a traditional setting. Approximately 400 students in the NTC district are served annually, receiving the attention necessary to help them succeed both academically and personally.

GENERAL EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT (GED)

The GED test is a computer-based exam that measures skills expected of high school graduates in the areas of reasoning through language arts, math, science, social studies and civics.

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA (HSED)

The HSED track offers individuals a self-paced, friendly environment where they can complete the same five exams as a GED, along with an additional health requirement. Upon completion, students are prepared to begin their job search or apply for college.

CREDIT RECOVERY

This program provides a positive option for students who were not meeting success in the more traditional high school setting. Students are given a second chance to stay in high school, further their education and graduated with a meaningful high school diploma.

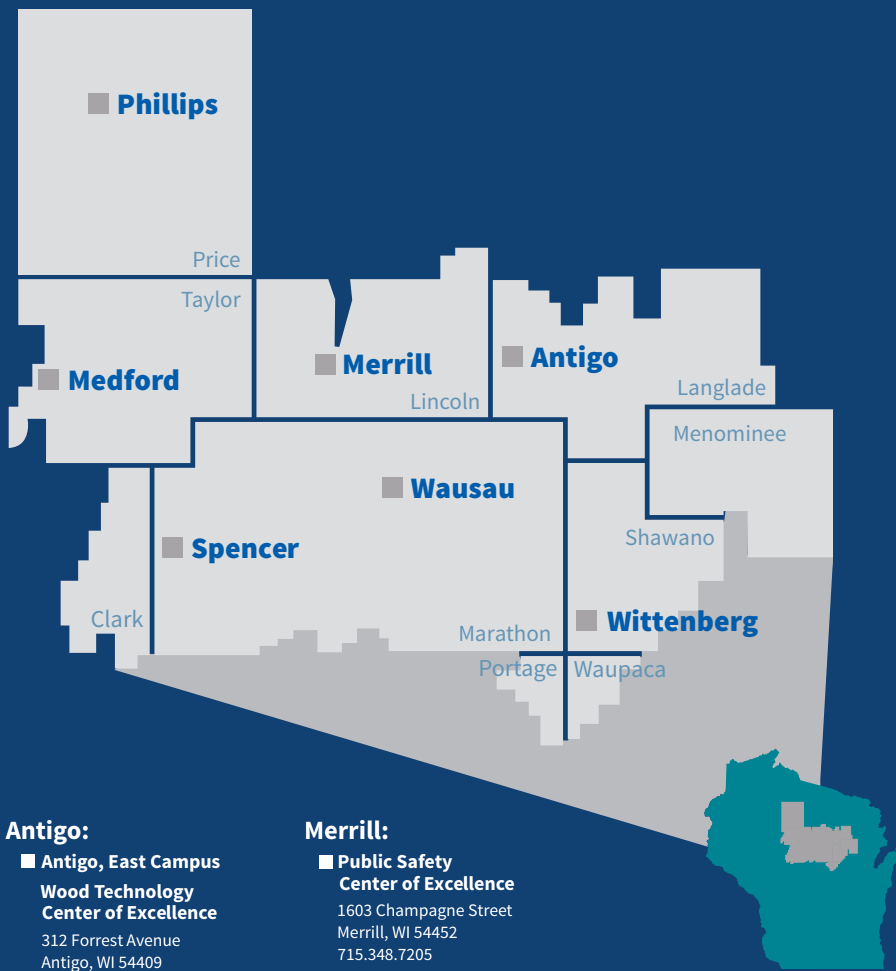
