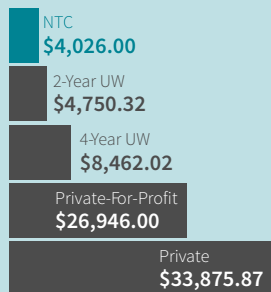

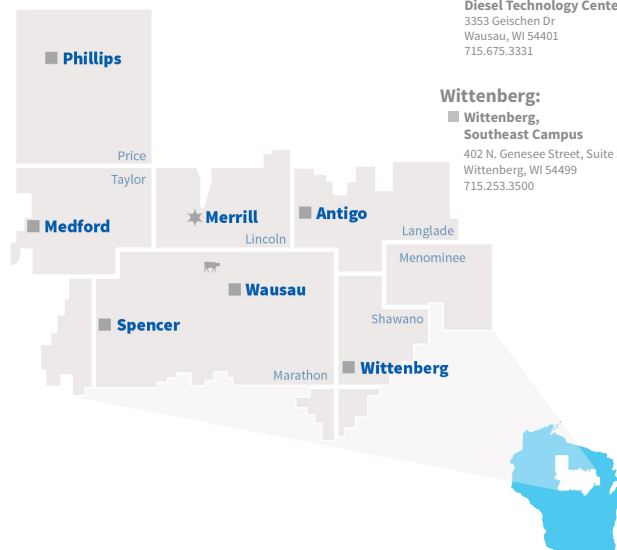

What Parents Need to Know About Dual Credit

QUESTION

What is Dual Credit?

ANSWER

Dual Credit is a free way for your student to experience the rigor of college courses with peers and teachers at his/her high school. Students can earn credit while in high school, save money and get a head start in NTC programs or elsewhere, as these credits may be transferable to other colleges.

QUESTION

Where are Dual Credit classes held?

ANSWER

Dual Credit classes are held at most high schools in the NTC district, so your student does not have to travel to an NTC campus to attend class.

QUESTION

Why is Dual Credit intended for mostly 11th and 12th graders?

ANSWER

Dual Credit is intended for juniors and seniors so your student can learn the most up-to-date curriculum and build upon the information after graduation as he/she transfers credits to NTC and other colleges and universities. Sophomores may be granted credit with prior approval from NTC.

QUESTION

Why does my student need his/her social security number to sign up for Dual Credit?

ANSWER

When students sign up for Dual Credit, they are becoming college students at NTC and we use social security numbers to accurately identify our students.

QUESTION

What if my student will not be attending NTC – why should he/she take Dual Credit?

ANSWER

That's okay, our credits transfer! If your student chooses to attend a college other than NTC, your student will need to request that his/her NTC transcript is evaluated for credit by the institution he/she plans to attend. The receiving institution will determine if the credits transfer into your son/daughter's intended academic plan. Students may need to advocate for the credit they have earned to receive, at minimum, an elective credit. 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QUESTION

Why is the grading scale different for Dual Credit courses?

ANSWER

Since Dual Credit is a college-level course, the high school instructor must adhere to the NTC grading scale and policies for the course. Your student will earn a high school-level grade on their high school transcript and a college-level grade on his/her NTC transcript, which may be different from the high school grade.

QUESTION

Does my student have to accept the credit if he/she receives an unfavorable grade?

ANSWER

Students can choose to either accept the college credit they complete at the end of each semester or deny the credit. High school instructors will confirm your student's grade at the end of the class, prior to submitting the final grade. If they do not want the credit an AU will appear on their transcript. This will not affect them in any way.

QUESTION

When should my student request transcripts?

ANSWER

Students can request an official NTC transcript for the 2018-19 academic year after July 8, 2019.

TO REQUEST A TRANSCRIPT:

1. Visit <https://myntc.ntc.edu>
2. Sign into MyNTC using your NTC Student ID (USER ID)
3. Click "Student Center"
4. Verify the grade is on your MyNTC account before requesting.
5. Click "Transcript" and choose "Official Transcript."
