The Financial Aid Office may consider exceptional/unusual circumstances to allow an otherwise dependent student to apply for aid without parental financial information. The Financial Aid Office is required by federal law to consider parent information unless the student meets specific criteria as defined on the FAFSA.

The following conditions do not qualify for a dependency override.

- **Parent(s) refusal to contribute to the student’s education.**
- **Parent(s) unwillingness to provide information on the FAFSA or for verification.**
- **Parent(s) do not claim the student as a dependent for income tax purposes.**
- **Student does not reside with parents.**
- **Student demonstrates total self-sufficiency.**
- **Student and parents have disagreements resulting in a strained relationship and have stopped talking with them.**

Only in **extremely unusual documented** situations can parental information be waived. A request for dependency override may be considered on a case-by-case basis if a student can document abandonment or neglect by the parents, an emotionally/physically abusive, unhealthy, or unsafe family environment, parental incarceration, estrangement, and/or inability to locate the parents.

NTC’s Financial Aid Office is not bound by a dependency override that was approved at another college. A dependency override at one college is not binding at another. Federal law requires the financial aid office at the college the student plans to attend or is currently attending to determine whether a dependency override is approved.

Dependency overrides require a student to be enrolled in classes at the time the request is submitted for consideration. A student becomes an ineligible student after they are no longer enrolled for the period of enrollment; therefore schools are not permitted to process requests after the student has ceased to be an eligible student.

If not already done, please complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by logging on to studentaid.gov and filing your 2024-2025 FAFSA online indicating you have a special circumstance and are unable to provide parental information.

Complete this form based on your relationship with your biological or legal parent(s). Conditions that MAY warrant a dependency override are listed below. Please mark all that apply to your situation.

- Abandonment:** Your parent(s) retained legal custody of you, but voluntarily left or were purposely absent. Their whereabouts are unknown, or you cannot readily reach them. You have not had contact with your parent(s) and they have not provided you with any emotional or financial support for an extended period of time.
- Abuse:** Your health or safety was at risk due to living with your parent(s) in an environment that included physical, sexual, emotional, verbal, or substance (drug/alcohol) abuse.
- Incarceration:** At least one parent is in prison as a result of their participation in illegal activities and you do not have contact with or receive any support from your other parent.
- Institutionalization:** At least one parent is institutionalized and lacks the mental capacity to complete the FAFSA and you do not have contact with or receive any support from your other parent.
- Death:** Your custodial parent is no longer living, and you do not have contact with or receive any support from your other parent. (If your custodial parent has passed away, submit a copy of their death certificate or obituary.)

Personal Statement by Student (Provide as much detail as possible)

Attach a typed personal statement that summarizes the unusual circumstances, being sure to include your name, date, and signature. Your statement should include the following information: (1) the specific reason(s) you cannot obtain your parent's information in completing the 2024-2025 FAFSA, explain in detail (2) describe the current status of your relationship with your parents, explain in detail (3) an explanation of your living arrangements and means of financial support (4) if supported by another individual, identify the individual(s), describing the nature of that support and state the period of time supported.

Personal Statement by Third Party

Attach a typed statement signed and dated from a public official (on letterhead) who has knowledge of your unusual circumstances and knowledge concerning your relationship with your parents (e.g. teacher, high school guidance counselor, member of clergy, law enforcement representative, social worker, government agency, medical authority, or clerk of courts). The letter must include the individual's name, title or position, address and signature. This person cannot be related to you or living at the same address.

Personal Statement by an Adult

Attach a typed statement signed and dated from a friend, relative, neighbor, or anyone with knowledge of your family situation.

Attach copies of any relevant supporting documentation (e.g. court documents, legal documents, or police reports).

Helpful Tips:

A legal parent includes a biological or adoptive parent, or a person that the state has determined to be your parent. Grandparents, foster parents, legal guardians, older brothers or sisters, widowed stepparents, and aunts and uncles are not considered parents unless they have legally adopted you.

After Filing the FAFSA and Submitting your Appeal:

✓ If your appeal is approved, we will notify you and we will submit a correction to the FAFSA Processing System with all appropriate dependency override codes. Your financial aid will be packaged based on independent status.

⊘ If your appeal is not approved, we will notify you about our decision. In order to receive a financial aid package, you MUST then provide parent financial information and signatures using FAFSA online. Return to <https://fafsa.ed.gov/>. Select "Correction," and provide all necessary information, including all required parent information and signatures.

Requests are typically reviewed within 1 – 2 weeks. Depending on your circumstances and current eligibility, the review may or may not warrant a change in your dependency status. The Financial Aid Office will notify you of the results with an email to your NTC student email account. If you have any questions, please feel free to email our office at financialaid@ntc.edu.

Please Note: Dependency overrides are approved on an annual basis. If your request is approved you will have to complete a dependency override renewal for each subsequent year confirming that the documented adverse family circumstances still exist.
