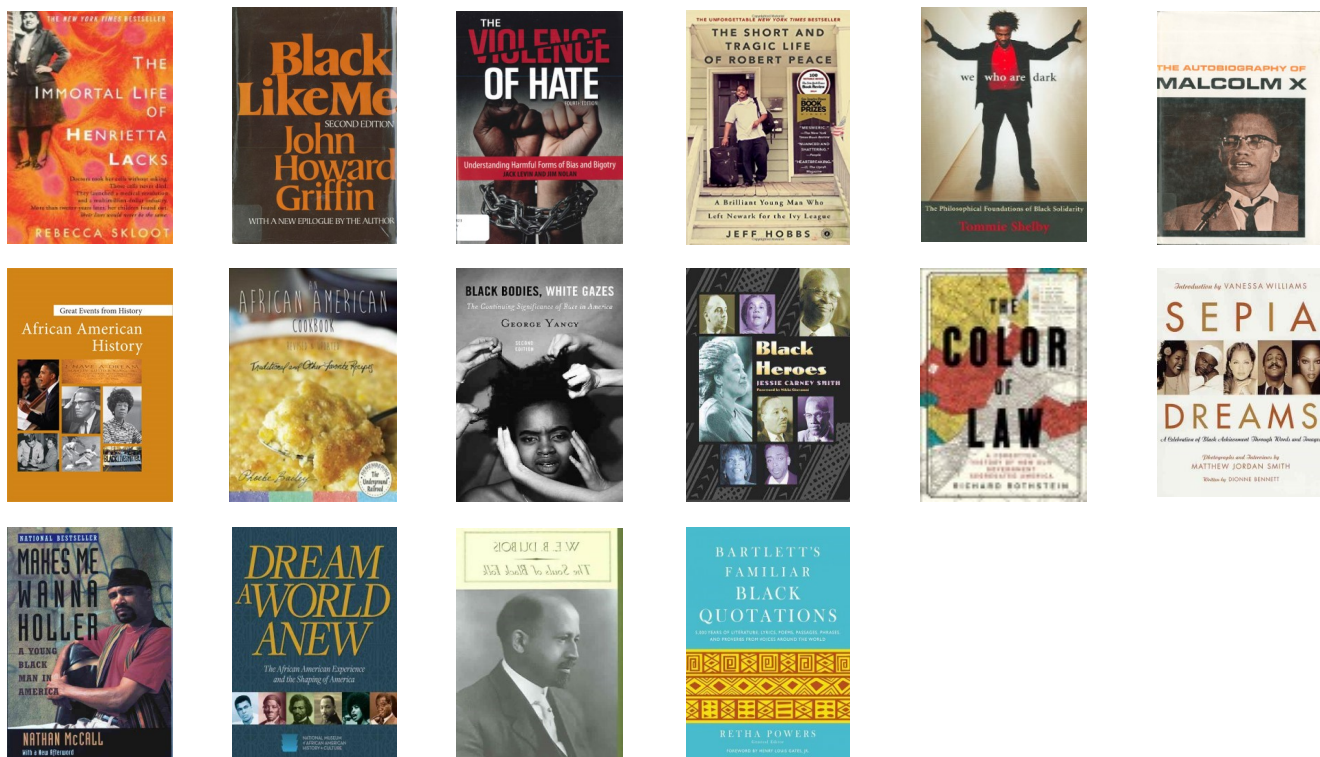
In honor of Martin Luther King Day and as a document of local history, the Wausau Daily Herald reran the story that was published during the visit, May 13, 1967.

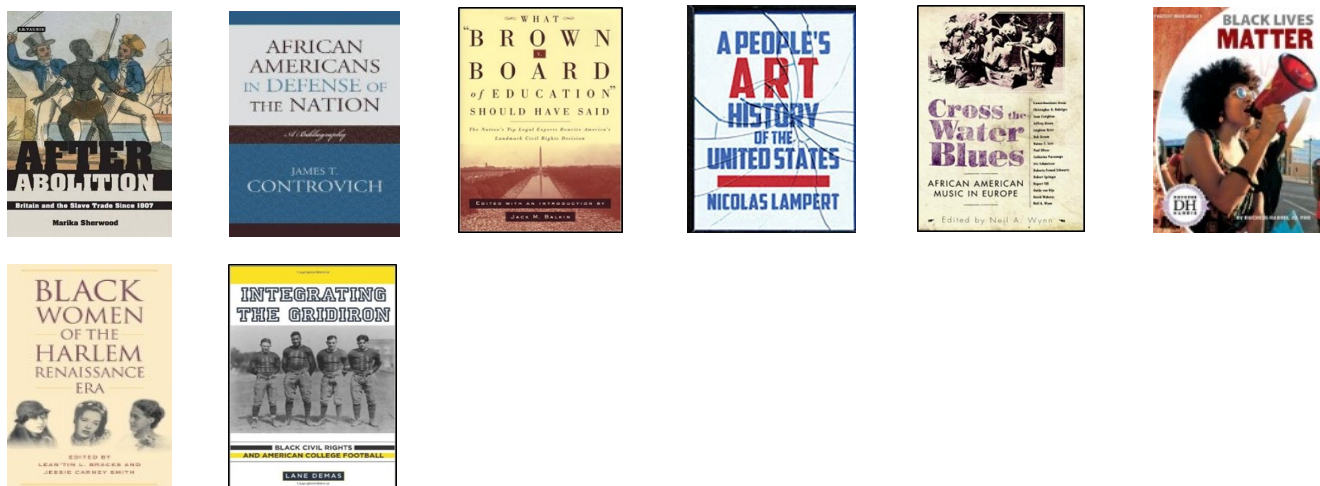
