

If you're thinking about transferring your Northcentral Technical College (NTC) associate degree into a bachelor's program, we've got you covered with guidance, transfer agreements and personalized care. Check out the information below and visit <https://www.ntc.edu/students/transfer> to find out which universities have degree completion agreements with NTC.

Step 1: Contact the Transfer & Career Services Office

Your first step is to contact NTC's Transfer Specialist. Our staff is happy to walk you through your transfer options, even if you're not sure which four-year school you would like to attend.

After you've decided which college you'd like to attend, we will review your unofficial transcript in order to get an idea of which of your credits will transfer, and which additional classes you might want to take during your remaining time at NTC.

You also have the option to explore our agreements on your own by browsing our listing of Transfer Guides. There, you can narrow down your choices and search by your major or preferred institution. You may also want to review the Universal Credit Transfer Agreement tool, which lets you view a list of courses that are transferable between NTC and every University of Wisconsin System school.

Step 2: Meet With Your Transfer College

We will connect you to the four-year transfer staff at your preferred institution. You can communicate with them via phone, email or in-person to discuss the classes you'll have to take after transferring. This is also your chance to talk about any additional educational options that may be available within your program, such as placing an emphasis on a certain area within your chosen field of study.

Step 3: Submit Your Application

Your final step is to apply to your four-year school of choice. After you apply, you'll receive a formal credit evaluation showing which of your NTC credits will transfer.

PREPARING TO TRANSFER

Before Meeting With A Transfer Partner:

- Check out websites of colleges/degrees of interest to you
- Bring a copy of your unofficial transcripts and transfer guides of interest
- Have a list of questions to ask and be ready to take notes!

Some Questions to Discuss:

Career Goals

- What is my career goal and how will this degree relate to my career goal?
- Will my bachelor's degree improve my ability to acquire a job or allow me to advance in my career field?

Location

- Do I need to travel to your campus to take classes and are the classes offered in a nontraditional format?
- Do you have classes at other campuses that might be more convenient for me?

Cost/Financial Aid

- What is the cost per credit for a class from this institution?
- Is there a difference in the cost of online courses versus in person courses?
- Are there any additional course fees?
- What do I have to do to receive financial aid at your college?

National/Regional Accreditation

- Is the college nationally or regionally accredited?
- Does your college have a physical location in a state?
- Will credits taken be accepted by other colleges for advanced degrees?

Credits

- What is the maximum number of credits I can transfer to your institution that will count toward my program?
- How many credits in the major/minor need to be completed at your institution?
- Does your college have semester or quarter credits?

Timing

- When can I apply? When can I register for classes?
- If I decide not to attend your institution or decide the classes are not for me, when is the withdrawal date?
- Are there opportunities for summer classes, winter/summer break classes, hybrid classes, weekend classes?

Housing

- How do I find out about available rental apartments in the area?
- How do I sign up for campus housing?
